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# Preventive policy on OSH

- In the interest of employers, employees and the surroundings
- More than complying with rules
- About participation and a pro-active attitude
- A change from compliance to participation
- A health and safety culture in companies
- Role of scientist, engineering and intermediary organizations



# Role of the government

- Providing (legal) frameworks
- Encouraging and facilitating businesses (programs)
- Promote prevention culture at national level
- Spreading information and knowledge
- Monitoring: effects and compliance with regulations, risk-based
- Enforcement by the Inspectorate



# Improvements Programs

## The Occupational Safety Improvement Program

- Additional approach for legislation / participation approach
- Business take the initiative and government supports
- Number of accidents <10%
  - Improvement actions
  - Quantitative risk model
  - Specific actions (for example)
    - » Campaign Always Alert
    - » Work Buddies in Metal

## Self regulation

- Focus on sector organizations
- Change from compliance to participation
- Intersectoral exchange and inspiration



# Prevention and safety as focus points

## New, effective and future-proof interventions

- Objective: Prevention, a culture change and safety as priority
- Collaboration of companies, branches, scientists, experts, producers, citizens, government -> all stakeholders
- Valuable for all companies working with dangerous substances and the complete chain around it
- With a focus on prevention on safety.



# Sustainable safety 2030

- Our mutual goal is a safer chemical industry
- This by prevention of accidents and achieving a culture change:

  - ✓ Transparency
  - ✓ Safe by design
  - ✓ Better exchange of lessons learned
